COOL DIEHL – Block #11

***Measurements for SMALL quilt; LARGE in (parentheses)

Cutting Instructions (See Notes * below)

You will make 3 of these blocks.

Cut from Prints:

- A Three 2-1/2" (3-1/2") Center squares (I used reds)
- B Twelve 2" (2-1/2") squares 4 each from 3 different prints; cut in half diagonally to make 24 triangles 8 of each print (square around center)
- ♦ C Twelve 2-1/2" (3") squares from 12 diff fabrics (star points)

Cut from Backgrounds:

- ♦ C Twelve 2-1/2" (3") squares from 12 diff fabrics (star points)
- D Twelve 1-1/2" (2") squares (corners)



Seams ¼" unless noted otherwise HST = Half-square Triangle RST = Right sides together

Block/Section Assembly:

NOTES:

- Cutting instructions for the TWELVE C squares (prints and backgrounds) are so that each of the 3 blocks can have 8 different colored star points. However, be aware that this will make twice as many HST's as you need, so half of them will not be used. So, if you are not making your blocks scrappy, or if you do not care that each block have all different colored star points, you will only need to cut SIX C squares (prints and backgrounds) to make your star points. I hope that's clearer than mud LOL!!!
- Directions are for <u>piecing</u> the star point units. If you prefer, you may <u>foundation piece</u> them using the attached patterns. Then pick back up with the Directions at Step #6.
- 1. Draw a diagonal line on the back of each **Background C** square.
- 2. Pair these with the twelve **Print C** squares, RST, and stitch a scant ¼" from each side of the drawn line. Cut on the line and press toward the **Print**. You will now have 24 HST for star points. Choose <u>ONE</u> of each pair and put aside the other, leaving you with 12 HST's. Square these to 2" (2-1/2").






3. Cut these HST in half diagonally to make 1 each left-leaning and right-leaning point.



4. Pair these with the 24 B triangles, RST. Note: choose 8 different HST star points for each of the 8 matching B triangle fabrics, making sure there are 4 each leaning left and right.



5. You will be sewing on the BIAS, so be careful not to stretch the fabrics as you stitch these together, using a scant %" seam. You should now have 24 units that look like the picture below – 12 that lean left and 12 that lean right. Lay them in the block design to determine how to press so they will nest. Square units to 1-1/2" (2").



- 6. Arrange these units along with the A and D squares to make 3 blocks according to the picture above right. Blocks should measure 4-1/2" (6-1/2") square unfinished.
- 7. Stitch the 3 blocks together side by side to make one large section. Unfinished section should measure 4-1/2"x12-1/2" (6-1/2"x18-1/2").

Design option:

For my own #11 section, I chose to make only two of the #11 blocks. In place of the 3rd, I used the test block I made for the optional Pieced Block #10. I really liked the block and wanted to use it in the quilt! Since it was smaller than the blocks for the #11 section, I surrounded it with scrappy strips of Background fabrics and then centered and trimmed it all around to measure the necessary 4-1/2" square to fit nicely in the middle of my two #11 blocks.
