Cutting Instructions:

A	Inner Border Strips	4	Black	1-1/2"x20-1/2"	2"x30-1/2"
B	Inner Border Cornerstones	4	Backgrounds	1-1/2" square	2" square
C	Flying Geese Bodies	20	Backgrounds	2-1/2"x4-1/2"	3-1/2"x6-1/2"
D	Flying Geese Wings	40	Prints	2-1/2" square	3-1/2" square
E	Outer Border Strips	4	Reds*	1-1/2"x20-1/2"	2"x30-1/2"
F	Sashing Corner Strips	8	Black	1-1/2"x3-1/2"	2"x5"
G	Border HSTs	8	Backgrounds	2" square	2-1/2" square
	-----	8	Reds	2" square	2-1/2" square
H	Pieced Border Cornerstones	4	Backgrounds	2-1/2" square	3-1/2" square
I	Pieced Border Cornerstones	4	Backgrounds	1-1/2" square	2" square

**I cut my reds from 4 different fabrics to get that extra dose of scrappiness!*

Assembly: Assemble your completed quilt block sections as follows: (you may also refer to the picture above)

- 1st row = Blocks 4 > 5 > two 8's (one over the other) > 8 over 6
- 2nd row = 3A over 9 > 1 > 10 > 7
- 3rd row = 3B over 11 > 2 > 12

***Measurements for SMALL quilt; LARGE in (parentheses)

Seams $\frac{1}{4}$ " unless noted otherwise
HST = Half-square Triangle
RST = Right sides together

Inner Border:

1. Stitch an **A Inner Border** strip to top and bottom of quilt center. Stitch **B Inner Border Cornerstone** squares to each end of the remaining two **A Inner Border** strips, then stitch strips to the sides. Press toward the border strips.

Pieced Border – Flying Geese Sides:

1. Make 20 Flying Geese (FG) units from the **C Body** background rectangles and the **D Wing** print squares. Refer to attached instructions for Making Flying Geese if needed. Each finished FG unit should measure $2\frac{1}{2}" \times 4\frac{1}{2}"$ ($3\frac{1}{2}" \times 6\frac{1}{2}"$).
2. Sew four sets of five FG units together side by side to form a FG section.
3. Stitch a red **E Outer Border** strip to the background side of each FG section. Press to the red border strip.
4. Stitch a black **F Sashing Corner** strip to each end of all four sections.
5. Stitch two of these **Flying Geese Side** sections to the top and bottom of the quilt as shown below.



Pieced Border – Cornerstone Blocks:

1. Make 16 HSTs: Draw a diagonal line on the back of each **G HST** background square. Pair these with the **G HST** red squares, RST. Stitch $\frac{1}{4}"$ on each side of the drawn diagonal line. Cut on the drawn line. Press the seams half toward the red fabrics and half toward the backgrounds. Square to $1\frac{1}{2}"$ (2").
2. Stitch two HSTs side by side as shown in step #1 below (will look like a flying geese unit) – make eight of these HST sections. Stitch the red side of four of these to one side of an **H square**, press toward the square. Sew an **I square** to the left side of the remaining four HST sections as shown in Step #2, pressing toward the square.



3. Stitch these together (seams should nest) to give you four **Pieced Cornerstone Blocks** as shown below.



4. Stitch a **Pieced Cornerstone Block** to each end of the remaining two **Flying Geese Side** sections. Attach these completed **Pieced Border** sections to the sides of your quilt.



5. Press seams toward the black Inner Border.
