## Choose lots of scrappy fabrics

(I chose primarily Kim Diehl fabrics - hence, the quilt's name!)

Four **Background** fabrics Variety of colorful **Prints** 

# \*\*\*Measurements for SMALL quilt; LARGE in (parentheses)

## Cut from EACH of the FOUR Background fabrics:

One: 1-1/2" (2") square [total of 4 squares] 1-1/2"x2-1/2" (2"x3-1/2") rectangle [total of 4 rectangles] 2" (2-1/2") square [total of 4 squares]

<u>Cut from Prints</u>: I used 16 different prints for ultimate scrappiness Eight 3" (4") squares – then cut in half diagonally to make 16 triangles \*You will only use half of the resulting triangles; save the rest for a later block Four 2" (2-1/2") squares Eight 1-1/2" (2") square (used in Flying Geese)



#### Unit Assembly:

1. Center HST's. Pair eight 3" (4") Print triangles together to make 4 HST units. Square each unit to 2-1/2" (3-1/2").



Border HST's. Draw a diagonal line on the back of each 2" (2-1/2") Background square. Pair these with the 2" (2-1/2") Print squares, RST. Stitch ¼" on each side of the drawn diagonal line. Cut on the drawn line to make 8 HST units. Press seams toward the Print fabric. Square to 1-1/2" (2").



- 3. Border Flying Geese. Make 4 Flying Geese units from the 1-1/2"x2-1/2" (2"x3-1/2") Background rectangles and the 1-1/2" (2") Print squares. Refer to attached instructions for <u>Making Flying Geese</u> if needed.
- 4. Stitch all units together according to the **Block** picture (upper right). Block should measure 6-1/2" (9-1/2").

Seams ¼" unless noted otherwise HST = Half-square Triangle RST = Right sides together
