## Choose lots of scrappy fabrics

(I chose primarily Kim Diehl fabrics - hence, the quilt's name!)

## Four Background fabrics

Variety of colorful Prints
***Measurements for SMALL quilt; LARGE in (parentheses)

## Cut from EACH of the FOUR Background fabrics:

One: 1-1/2" (2") square [total of 4 squares]
$1-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 2-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}\left(2^{\prime \prime} \times 3-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}\right)$ rectangle [total of 4 rectangles] $2^{\prime \prime}\left(2-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}\right)$ square [total of 4 squares]


## Cut from Prints: I used 16 different prints for ultimate scrappiness

Eight $3^{\prime \prime}\left(4^{\prime \prime}\right)$ squares - then cut in half diagonally to make 16 triangles
*You will only use half of the resulting triangles; save the rest for a later block
Four 2" (2-1/2") squares
Eight 1-1/2" (2") square (used in Flying Geese)

## Unit Assembly:

1. Center HST's. Pair eight $3^{\prime \prime}\left(4^{\prime \prime}\right)$ Print triangles together to make 4 HST units. Square each unit to $2-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}\left(3-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}\right)$.

2. Border HST's. Draw a diagonal line on the back of each $2^{\prime \prime}\left(2-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}\right)$ Background square. Pair these with the 2" (2$\left.1 / 2^{\prime \prime}\right)$ Print squares, RST. Stitch $1 / 4$ " on each side of the drawn diagonal line. Cut on the drawn line to make 8 HST units. Press seams toward the Print fabric. Square to 1-1/2" (2").

3. Border Flying Geese. Make 4 Flying Geese units from the $1-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 2-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}\left(2^{\prime \prime} \times 3-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}\right)$ Background rectangles and the $1-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}\left(2^{\prime \prime}\right)$ Print squares. Refer to attached instructions for Making Flying Geese if needed.
4. Stitch all units together according to the Block picture (upper right). Block should measure 6-1/2" (9-1/2").
