## Cut：

Three 1－1／2＂（1－3／4＂）Print squares from 3 different fabrics Six 2－1／4＂（3＂）Background squares from 6 different fabrics

## Making the Units

1．Cut the Background squares in half diagonally，to give you 12 triangles．


2．Fold to crease the middles of each Background triangle（long edge）and all four sides of each Print square．
3．Using the creases to line up your pieces，sew a Background triangle to each Print square，RST．


Sew another triangle to the opposing side of the square．Press toward the square．Trim edges even with the square as shown below．


4．Now line up and sew two more triangles to the remaining sides of the square．Remember to mix up your fabrics so you have a different background fabric on all four sides of each unit．Press toward the triangles．It is important to be sure you center your inner square when squaring up your unit to measure $2-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}\left(3-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}\right)$ ．Also keep your square perfectly diagonal by making sure all 4 corners are intersected by a line（example on right－my sample unit）．


5．Make 3 units．Stitch them together as shown in the photo above right to make your block．
