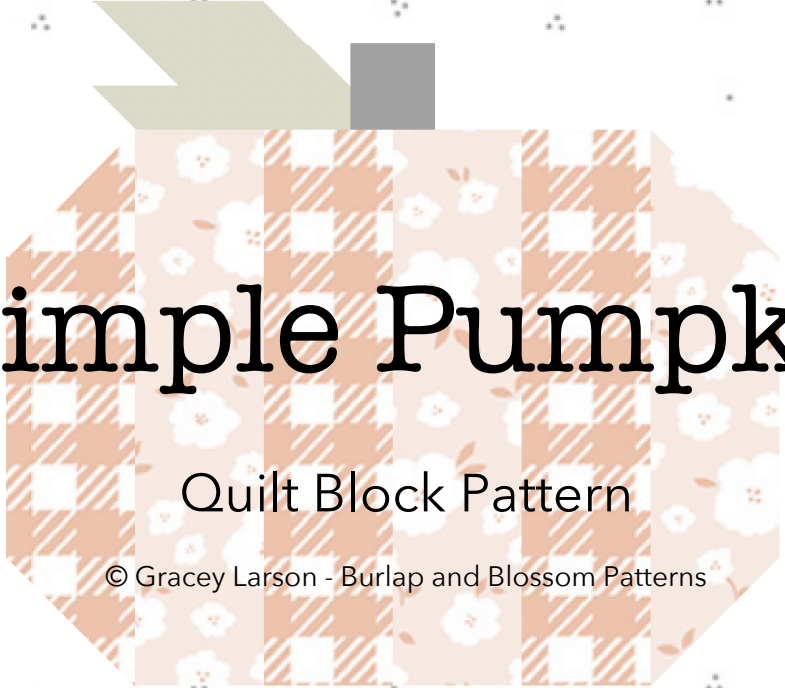




Simple Pumpkin

Quilt Block Pattern

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- 6, 12, 18, and 24 Inch finished blocks
- Seam allowances are $\frac{1}{4}$ " unless otherwise instructed
 - Press seams open recommended
- Instructions are written for 6 Inch blocks with other blocks sizes in parentheses: 6" (12") (18") (24").



Background (White):

	6" Block Pieces	12" Block Pieces	18" Block Pieces	24" Block Pieces
1	One - 1 ½" x 3 ¼"	One - 2 ½" x 6"	One - 3 ½" x 8 ¾"	One - 4 ½" x 11 ½"
2	One - 1 ¼" x 1 ¾"	One - 2" x 3"	One - 2 ¾" x 4 ¼"	One - 3 ½" x 5 ½"
3	One - 2 ¼" x 3 ¼"	One - 4" x 6"	One - 5 ¾" x 8 ¾"	One - 7 ½" x 11 ½"
4	One - 1" x 1 ¾"	One - 1 ½" x 3"	One - 2" x 4 ¼"	One - 2 ½" x 5 ½"
5	Two - 1" x 1"	Two - 1 ½" x 1 ½"	Two - 2" x 2"	Two - 2 ½" x 2 ½"
6	One - ¾" x ¾"	One - 1" x 1"	One - 1 ¼" x 1 ¼"	One - 1 ½" x 1 ½"
7	Four - 1 ¼" x 1 ¼"	Four - 2" x 2"	Four - 2 ¾" x 2 ¾"	Four - 3 ½" x 3 ½"
8	Two - 1 ¼" x 3 ¾"	Two - 2" x 7"	Two - 2 ¾" x 10 ¼"	Two - 3 ½" x 13 ½"
9	One - 1 ½" x 6 ½"	One - 2 ½" x 12 ½"	One - 3 ½" x 18 ½"	One - 4 ½" x 24 ½"

Stem (Brown):

	6" Block pieces	12" Block pieces	18" Block pieces	24" Block pieces
10	One - 1" x 1"	One - 1 ½" x 1 ½"	One - 2" x 2"	One - 2 ½" x 2 ½"

Leaf (Green):

	6" Block pieces	12" Block pieces	18" Block pieces	24" Block pieces
11	One - 1" x 2"	One - 1 ½" x 3 ½"	One - 2" x 5"	One - 2 ½" x 6 ½"
12	One - ¾" x 2"	One - 1" x 3 ½"	One - 1 ¼" x 5"	One - 1 ½" x 6 ½"

Pumpkin Stripes (Orange 1):

13	Three - 1 ¼" x 3 ¾"	Three - 2" x 7"	Three - 2 ¾" x 10 ¼"	Three - 3 ½" x 13 ½"

Pumpkin Stripes (Orange 2):

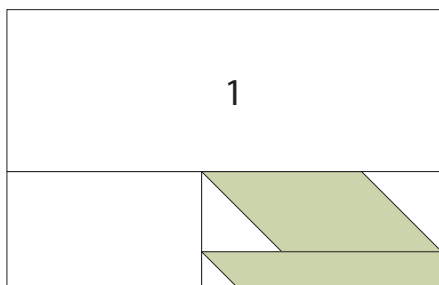
	6" Block pieces	12" Block pieces	18" Block pieces	24" Block pieces
14	Three - 1 ¼" x 3 ¾"	Three - 2" x 7"	Three - 2 ¾" x 10 ¼"	Three - 3 ½" x 13 ½"

Constructing the block:

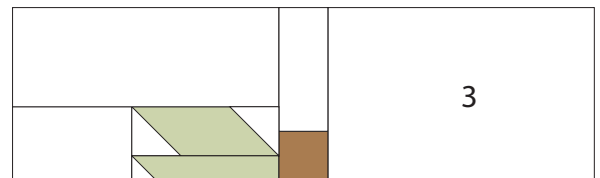
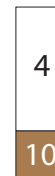
1. Mark a diagonal line on the wrong side of the 5 pieces. With right sides facing, place a 5 piece on the bottom left corner of the 11 piece. Stitch on the marked line. Trim ¼" away from the stitched line and press. Repeat on the top right corner of the 11 piece.



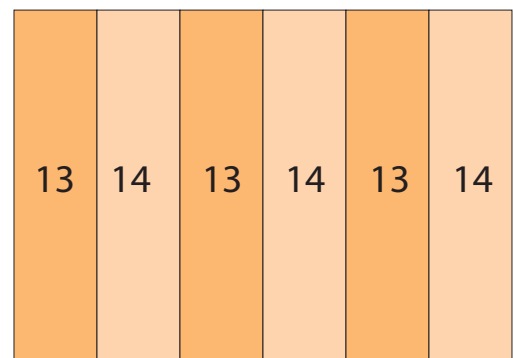
2. Mark a diagonal line on the wrong side of the 6 pieces. With right sides facing, place a 6 piece on the bottom left corner of the 12 piece. Stitch on the marked line. Trim ¼" away from the stitched line and press. Join the 11 piece to the top of the 12 piece. Join the 2 piece to the left side of the 12 piece to form the leaf unit. Join the 1 piece to the top of the leaf unit so that the leaf unit measures 2 ¼" x 3 ¼" (4" x 6") (5 ¾" x 8 ¾") (7 ½" x 11 ½").



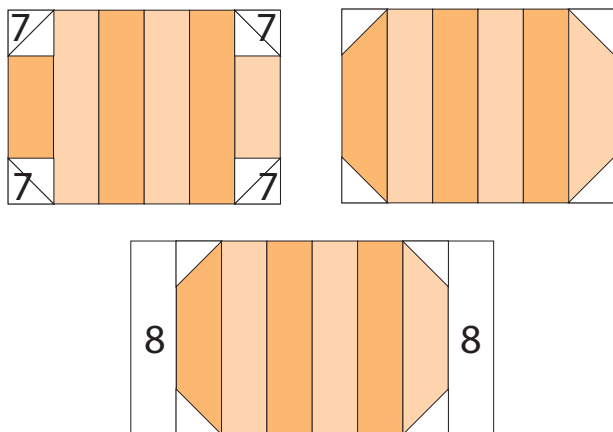
3. Join the 4 piece to the top of the 10 piece to form the stem unit. Join the 3 piece to the right side of the stem unit and join the leaf unit to the left side of the stem unit so that the stem unit measures 2 ¼" x 6 ½" (4" x 12 ½") (5 ¾" x 18 ½") (7 ½" x 24 ½").



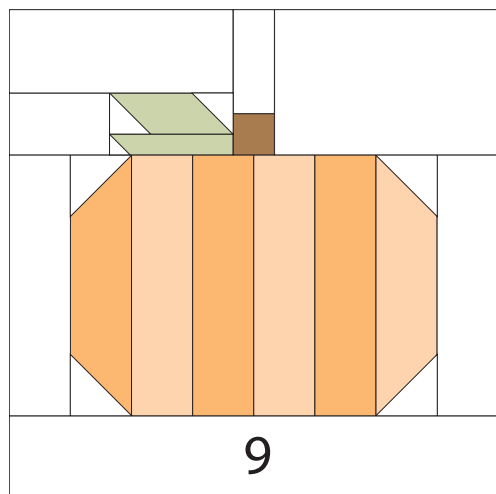
4. Join the 13 pieces and the 14 pieces together as pictured, alternating, beginning with a 13 piece and ending with a 14 piece to form the pumpkin unit which should measure 3 ¾" x 5" (7" x 9 ½") (10 ¼" x 14") (13 ½" x 18 ½").



5. Mark a diagonal line on the wrong side of the 7 pieces. With right sides facing, place a 7 piece on the top left corner of the pumpkin unit. Stitch on the marked line. Trim $\frac{1}{4}$ " away from the stitched line and press. Repeat on all remaining corners of the pumpkin unit. Join an 8 piece to the left and right sides of the pumpkin unit so that the pumpkin unit now measures $3\frac{3}{4}" \times 6\frac{1}{2}"$ ($7" \times 12\frac{1}{2}"$) ($10\frac{1}{4}" \times 18\frac{1}{2}"$) ($13\frac{1}{2}" \times 24\frac{1}{2}"$).



6. Join the stem unit to the top of the pumpkin unit and join the 9 piece to the bottom of the pumpkin unit to form the finished block which should measure $6\frac{1}{2}" \times 6\frac{1}{2}"$ ($12\frac{1}{2}" \times 12\frac{1}{2}"$) ($18\frac{1}{2}" \times 18\frac{1}{2}"$) ($24\frac{1}{2}" \times 24\frac{1}{2}"$).

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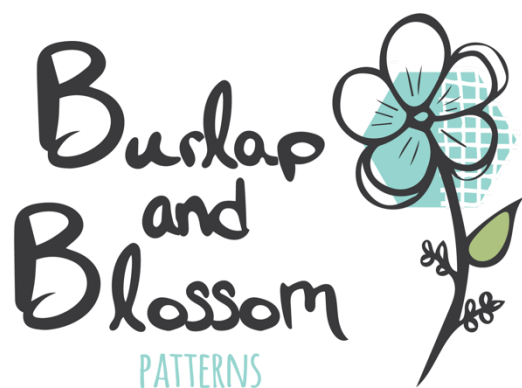


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
